## SENATE BILL NO. 402—SENATOR WOODHOUSE

MARCH 20, 2019

Referred to Committee on Growth and Infrastructure

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning educational programs relating to science, technology, engineering and mathematics and makes an appropriation. (BDR 43-887)

AN ACT relating to educational programs; providing for the issuance of a special license plate indicating support for educational programs in science, technology, engineering and mathematics; imposing a fee for the issuance and renewal of such special license plates; revising provisions related to the promotion and recognition of educational programs in this State that teach science, technology, engineering and mathematics; making appropriations to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology to fund certain programs and activities relating to science, technology, engineering and mathematics; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

**Section 1** of this bill requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to design, prepare and issue special license plates indicating support for educational programs in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, commonly referred to as "STEM." The fees generated by the special license plates that are in addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services and taxes are required to be deposited with the State Treasurer, who must, on a quarterly basis, distribute the fees to the Director of the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology. The Director is required to consult with the Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics to identify nonprofit corporations to assist in distributing the funds in a manner designed to encourage the study of science, technology, engineering and mathematics by pupils in this State. A person wishing to obtain the special license plates may also request that the plates be combined with personalized prestige plates if the person pays the additional fees for the personalized prestige plates.

Under existing law, certain special license plates: (1) must be approved by the Department, based on a recommendation from the Commission on Special License Plates; (2) are subject to a limitation on the number of separate designs of special license plates which the Department may issue at any one time; and (3) may not be designed, prepared or issued by the Department unless a certain number of applications for the plates are received. (NRS 482.367004, 482.367008, 482.36705) **Sections 6-8** of this bill exempt the special license plates indicating support for educational programs in science, technology, engineering and mathematics from each of the proceeding requirements. **Sections 2-5 and 9-12** of this bill make conforming changes.

Under existing law the Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics is required to develop a plan for identifying and awarding recognition to not more than 15 schools in this State that demonstrate exemplary performance in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The Council must also establish an event in southern Nevada and an event in northern Nevada to recognize students for similar exemplary performance, with the events required to be held at an institution of higher education in this State. Finally, the Council must establish a statewide event to be held in Carson City to recognize the not more than 15 schools in this State identified for exemplary performance. (NRS 223.650) **Section 13** of this bill removes the limitation of 15 schools, removes the requirement that the northern and southern events be held at institutions of higher education, and removes the requirement that the statewide event be held in Carson City.

Finally, **section 14** of this bill makes two appropriations to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology. The first is for awarding grants to elementary schools in this state to promote equitable access to and increase the quality of programs designed to introduce and teach science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The second is to create a regional grant program in each of three regions of this State through regional advisory boards, with the grants to be used to fund activities and programs designed to increase awareness of, promote the benefits of and carry out programs that reinforce education in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 482 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

*1. The Department, in cooperation with the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of Governor, shall design, prepare and issue license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics, using any colors that the Department deems appropriate.*

*2. The Department shall issue license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics for a passenger car or light commercial vehicle upon application by a person who is entitled to license plates pursuant to NRS 482.265 and who otherwise complies with the requirements for registration and licensing pursuant to this chapter. A person may request that personalized prestige license plates issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 be combined with license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics if that person pays the fees for the personalized prestige license plates in addition to the fees for the license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics pursuant to subsection 3.*

*3. The fee for license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics is \$35, in addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes. The license plates are renewable upon the payment to the Department of \$10.*

*4. In addition to all other applicable registration and license fees and governmental services taxes and the fee prescribed pursuant to subsection 3, a person who requests a set of license plates that indicate support for educational programs in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics must pay for the issuance of the plates an additional fee of \$25 and for each renewal of*

1 *the plates an additional fee of \$20, to be deposited in accordance with subsection*  
2 *5.*

3 *5. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.38279, the Department shall*  
4 *deposit the fees collected pursuant to subsection 4 with the State Treasurer for*  
5 *credit to the State General Fund. The State Treasurer shall, on a quarterly basis,*  
6 *distribute the fees deposited pursuant to this subsection to the Director of the*  
7 *Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor. The*  
8 *Director of the Office, in consultation with the Advisory Council on Science,*  
9 *Technology, Engineering and Mathematics created by NRS 223.640, shall*  
10 *identify nonprofit corporations in this State to assist in the distribution of the*  
11 *funds from this section in a manner designed to encourage the study of science,*  
12 *technology, engineering and mathematics by pupils in this State.*

13 *6. The provisions of NRS 482.36705 do not apply to license plates described*  
14 *in this section.*

15 *7. If, during a registration period, the holder of license plates issued*  
16 *pursuant to the provisions of this section disposes of the vehicle to which the*  
17 *plates are affixed, the holder shall:*

18 *(a) Retain the plates and affix them to another vehicle that meets the*  
19 *requirements of this section if the holder pays the fee for the transfer of the*  
20 *registration and any registration fee or governmental services tax due pursuant to*  
21 *NRS 482.399; or*

22 *(b) Within 30 days after removing the plates from the vehicle, return them to*  
23 *the Department.*

24 *8. The Department may accept any gifts, grants and donations or other*  
25 *sources of money for the production and issuance of the special license plates*  
26 *pursuant to this section. All money received pursuant to this subsection must be*  
27 *deposited in the Revolving Account for the Issuance of Special License Plates*  
28 *created by NRS 482.1805.*

29 **Sec. 2.** NRS 482.2065 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 482.2065 1. A trailer may be registered for a 3-year period as provided in  
31 this section.

32 2. A person who registers a trailer for a 3-year period must pay upon  
33 registration all fees and taxes that would be due during the 3-year period if he or  
34 she registered the trailer for 1 year and renewed that registration for 2 consecutive  
35 years immediately thereafter, including, without limitation:

36 (a) Registration fees pursuant to NRS 482.480 and 482.483.

37 (b) A fee for each license plate issued pursuant to NRS 482.268.

38 (c) Fees for the initial issuance, reissuance and renewal of a special license  
39 plate pursuant to NRS 482.265, if applicable.

40 (d) Fees for the initial issuance and renewal of a personalized prestige license  
41 plate pursuant to NRS 482.367, if applicable.

42 (e) Additional fees for the initial issuance and renewal of a special license plate  
43 issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823, inclusive, *and section 1 of this act*  
44 *which are imposed to generate financial support for a particular cause or charitable*  
45 *organization, if applicable.*

46 (f) Governmental services taxes imposed pursuant to chapter 371 of NRS, as  
47 provided in NRS 482.260.

48 (g) The applicable taxes imposed pursuant to chapters 372, 374, 377 and 377A  
49 of NRS.

50 3. A license plate issued pursuant to this section will be reissued as provided  
51 in NRS 482.265 except that such reissuance will be done at the first renewal after  
52 the license plate has been issued for not less than 8 years.

1        4. As used in this section, the term “trailer” does not include a full trailer or  
2 semitrailer that is registered pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 482.483.

3        **Sec. 3.** NRS 482.216 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4        482.216 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.2155, upon the  
5 request of a new vehicle dealer, the Department may authorize the new vehicle  
6 dealer to:

7        (a) Accept applications for the registration of the new motor vehicles he or she  
8 sells and the related fees and taxes;

9        (b) Issue certificates of registration to applicants who satisfy the requirements  
10 of this chapter; and

11        (c) Accept applications for the transfer of registration pursuant to NRS 482.399  
12 if the applicant purchased from the new vehicle dealer a new vehicle to which the  
13 registration is to be transferred.

14        2. A new vehicle dealer who is authorized to issue certificates of registration  
15 pursuant to subsection 1 shall:

16        (a) Transmit the applications received to the Department within the period  
17 prescribed by the Department;

18        (b) Transmit the fees collected from the applicants and properly account for  
19 them within the period prescribed by the Department;

20        (c) Comply with the regulations adopted pursuant to subsection 5; and

21        (d) Bear any cost of equipment which is necessary to issue certificates of  
22 registration, including any computer hardware or software.

23        3. A new vehicle dealer who is authorized to issue certificates of registration  
24 pursuant to subsection 1 shall not:

25        (a) Charge any additional fee for the performance of those services;

26        (b) Receive compensation from the Department for the performance of those  
27 services;

28        (c) Accept applications for the renewal of registration of a motor vehicle; or

29        (d) Accept an application for the registration of a motor vehicle if the applicant  
30 wishes to:

31        (1) Obtain special license plates pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823,  
32 inclusive ~~§~~, *and section 1 of this act*; or

33        (2) Claim the exemption from the governmental services tax provided  
34 pursuant to NRS 361.1565 to veterans and their relations.

35        4. The provisions of this section do not apply to the registration of a moped  
36 pursuant to NRS 482.2155.

37        5. The Director shall adopt such regulations as are necessary to carry out the  
38 provisions of this section. The regulations adopted pursuant to this subsection must  
39 provide for:

40        (a) The expedient and secure issuance of license plates and decals by the  
41 Department; and

42        (b) The withdrawal of the authority granted to a new vehicle dealer pursuant to  
43 subsection 1 if that dealer fails to comply with the regulations adopted by the  
44 Department.

45        **Sec. 4.** NRS 482.2703 is hereby amended to read as follows:

46        482.2703 1. The Director may order the preparation of sample license plates  
47 which must be of the same design and size as regular license plates or license plates  
48 issued pursuant to NRS 482.384. The Director shall ensure that:

49        (a) Each license plate issued pursuant to this subsection, regardless of its  
50 design, is inscribed with the word SAMPLE and an identical designation which  
51 consists of the same group of three numerals followed by the same group of three  
52 letters; and

(b) The designation of numerals and letters assigned pursuant to paragraph (a) is not assigned to a vehicle registered pursuant to this chapter or chapter 706 of NRS.

2. The Director may order the preparation of sample license plates which must be of the same design and size as any of the special license plates issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823, inclusive **[H]**, *and section 1 of this act*. The Director shall ensure that:

(a) Each license plate issued pursuant to this subsection, regardless of its design, is inscribed with the word SAMPLE and the number zero in the location where any other numerals would normally be displayed on a license plate of that design; and

(b) The number assigned pursuant to paragraph (a) is not assigned to a vehicle registered pursuant to this chapter or chapter 706 of NRS.

3. The Director may establish a fee for the issuance of sample license plates of not more than \$15 for each license plate.

4. A decal issued pursuant to NRS 482.271 may be displayed on a sample license plate issued pursuant to this section.

5. All money collected from the issuance of sample license plates must be deposited in the State Treasury for credit to the Motor Vehicle Fund.

6. A person shall not affix a sample license plate issued pursuant to this section to a vehicle. A person who violates the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor.

**Sec. 5.** NRS 482.274 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.274 1. The Director shall order the preparation of vehicle license plates for trailers in the same manner provided for motor vehicles in NRS 482.270, except that a vehicle license plate prepared for a full trailer or semitrailer that is registered pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 482.483 is not required to have displayed upon it the month and year the registration expires.

2. The Director shall order preparation of two sizes of vehicle license plates for trailers. The smaller plates may be used for trailers with a gross vehicle weight of less than 1,000 pounds.

3. The Director shall determine the registration numbers assigned to trailers.

4. Any license plates issued for a trailer before July 1, 1975, bearing a different designation from that provided for in this section, are valid during the period for which such plates were issued.

5. Any license plates issued for a trailer before January 1, 1982, are not subject to reissue pursuant to subsection 2 of NRS 482.265.

6. The Department shall not issue for a full trailer or semitrailer that is registered pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 482.483 a special license plate available pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823, inclusive **[H]**, *and section 1 of this act*.

**Sec. 6.** NRS 482.367004 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.367004 1. There is hereby created the Commission on Special License Plates. The Commission is advisory to the Department and consists of five Legislators and three nonvoting members as follows:

(a) Five Legislators appointed by the Legislative Commission:

(1) One of whom is the Legislator who served as the Chair of the Assembly Standing Committee on Transportation during the most recent legislative session. That Legislator may designate an alternate to serve in place of the Legislator when absent. The alternate must be another Legislator who also served on the Assembly Standing Committee on Transportation during the most recent legislative session.

(2) One of whom is the Legislator who served as the Chair of the Senate Standing Committee on Transportation during the most recent legislative session.

1 That Legislator may designate an alternate to serve in place of the Legislator when  
2 absent. The alternate must be another Legislator who also served on the Senate  
3 Standing Committee on Transportation during the most recent legislative session.

4 (b) Three nonvoting members consisting of:

5 (1) The Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles, or a designee of the  
6 Director.

7 (2) The Director of the Department of Public Safety, or a designee of the  
8 Director.

9 (3) The Director of the Department of Tourism and Cultural Affairs, or a  
10 designee of the Director.

11 2. Each member of the Commission appointed pursuant to paragraph (a) of  
12 subsection 1 serves a term of 2 years, commencing on July 1 of each odd-numbered  
13 year. A vacancy on the Commission must be filled in the same manner as the  
14 original appointment.

15 3. Members of the Commission serve without salary or compensation for their  
16 travel or per diem expenses.

17 4. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau shall provide  
18 administrative support to the Commission.

19 5. The Commission shall recommend to the Department that the Department  
20 approve or disapprove:

21 (a) Applications for the design, preparation and issuance of special license  
22 plates that are submitted to the Department pursuant to subsection 1 of NRS  
23 482.367002;

24 (b) The issuance by the Department of special license plates that have been  
25 designed and prepared pursuant to NRS 482.367002; and

26 (c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 7, applications for the design,  
27 preparation and issuance of special license plates that have been authorized by an  
28 act of the Legislature after January 1, 2007.

29 ➤ In determining whether to recommend to the Department the approval of such an  
30 application or issuance, the Commission shall consider, without limitation, whether  
31 it would be appropriate and feasible for the Department to, as applicable, design,  
32 prepare or issue the particular special license plate. For the purpose of making  
33 recommendations to the Department, the Commission shall consider each  
34 application in the chronological order in which the application was received by the  
35 Department.

36 6. On or before September 1 of each fiscal year, the Commission shall  
37 compile a list of each special license plate for which the Commission, during the  
38 immediately preceding fiscal year, recommended to the Department that the  
39 Department approve the application for the special license plate or approve the  
40 issuance of the special license plate. The list so compiled must set forth, for each  
41 such plate, the cause or charitable organization for which the special license plate  
42 generates or would generate financial support, and the intended use to which the  
43 financial support is being put or would be put. The Commission shall transmit the  
44 information described in this subsection to the Department and the Department  
45 shall make that information available on its Internet website.

46 7. The provisions of paragraph (c) of subsection 5 do not apply with regard to  
47 special license plates that are issued pursuant to NRS 482.3746, 482.3751,  
48 482.3752, 482.3757, 482.3783, 482.3785, 482.3787 or 482.37901 **or section 1 of**  
49 **this act.**

50 8. The Commission shall:

51 (a) Recommend to the Department that the Department approve or disapprove  
52 any proposed change in the distribution of money received in the form of additional  
53 fees. As used in this paragraph, "additional fees" means the fees that are charged in



1 connection with the issuance or renewal of a special license plate for the benefit of  
2 a particular cause, fund or charitable organization. The term does not include  
3 registration and license fees or governmental services taxes.

4 (b) If it recommends a proposed change pursuant to paragraph (a) and  
5 determines that legislation is required to carry out the change, recommend to the  
6 Department that the Department request the assistance of the Legislative Counsel in  
7 the preparation of a bill draft to carry out the change.

8 **Sec. 7.** NRS 482.367008 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 482.367008 1. As used in this section, "special license plate" means:

10 (a) A license plate that the Department has designed and prepared pursuant to  
11 NRS 482.367002 in accordance with the system of application and petition  
12 described in that section;

13 (b) A license plate approved by the Legislature that the Department has  
14 designed and prepared pursuant to NRS 482.3747, 482.37903, 482.37905,  
15 482.37917, 482.379175, 482.37918, 482.37919, 482.3792, 482.3793, 482.37933,  
16 482.37934, 482.37935, 482.379355, 482.379365, 482.37937, 482.379375,  
17 482.37938, 482.37939, 482.37945 or 482.37947; and

18 (c) Except for a license plate that is issued pursuant to NRS 482.3746,  
19 482.3751, 482.3752, 482.3757, 482.3783, 482.3785, 482.3787 or 482.37901 ~~(H)~~ or  
20 *section 1 of this act*, a license plate that is approved by the Legislature after July 1,  
21 2005.

22 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, and except as  
23 otherwise provided in subsection 3, the Department shall not, at any one time, issue  
24 more than 30 separate designs of special license plates. Whenever the total number  
25 of separate designs of special license plates issued by the Department at any one  
26 time is less than 30, the Department shall issue a number of additional designs of  
27 special license plates that have been authorized by an act of the Legislature or the  
28 application for which has been recommended by the Commission on Special  
29 License Plates to be approved by the Department pursuant to subsection 5 of NRS  
30 482.367004, not to exceed a total of 30 designs issued by the Department at any  
31 one time. Such additional designs must be issued by the Department in accordance  
32 with the chronological order of their authorization or approval by the Department.

33 3. In addition to the special license plates described in subsection 2, the  
34 Department may issue not more than five separate designs of special license plates  
35 in excess of the limit set forth in that subsection. To qualify for issuance pursuant to  
36 this subsection:

37 (a) The Commission on Special License Plates must have recommended to the  
38 Department that the Department approve the design, preparation and issuance of the  
39 special plates as described in paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection 5 of NRS  
40 482.367004; and

41 (b) The special license plates must have been applied for, designed, prepared  
42 and issued pursuant to NRS 482.367002, except that:

43 (1) The application for the special license plates must be accompanied by a  
44 surety bond posted with the Department in the amount of \$20,000; and

45 (2) Pursuant to the assessment of the viability of the design of the special  
46 license plates that is conducted pursuant to this section, it is determined that at least  
47 3,000 special license plates have been issued.

48 4. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, on October 1 of each year  
49 the Department shall assess the viability of each separate design of special license  
50 plate that the Department is currently issuing by determining the total number of  
51 validly registered motor vehicles to which that design of special license plate is  
52 affixed. The Department shall not determine the total number of validly registered  
53 motor vehicles to which a particular design of special license plate is affixed if:

1 (a) The particular design of special license plate was designed and prepared by  
2 the Department pursuant to NRS 482.367002; and

3 (b) On October 1, that particular design of special license plate has been  
4 available to be issued for less than 12 months.

5 5. If, on October 1, the total number of validly registered motor vehicles to  
6 which a particular design of special license plate is affixed is:

7 (a) In the case of special license plates not described in subsection 3, less than  
8 1,000; or

9 (b) In the case of special license plates described in subsection 3, less than  
10 3,000,

11 ➤ the Director shall provide notice of that fact in the manner described in  
12 subsection 6.

13 6. The notice required pursuant to subsection 5 must be provided:

14 (a) If the special license plate generates financial support for a cause or  
15 charitable organization, to that cause or charitable organization.

16 (b) If the special license plate does not generate financial support for a cause or  
17 charitable organization, to an entity which is involved in promoting the activity,  
18 place or other matter that is depicted on the plate.

19 7. If, on December 31 of the same year in which notice was provided pursuant  
20 to subsections 5 and 6, the total number of validly registered motor vehicles to  
21 which a particular design of special license plate is affixed is:

22 (a) In the case of special license plates not described in subsection 3, less than  
23 1,000; or

24 (b) In the case of special license plates described in subsection 3, less than  
25 3,000,

26 ➤ the Director shall, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,  
27 issue an order providing that the Department will no longer issue that particular  
28 design of special license plate. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of  
29 NRS 482.265, such an order does not require existing holders of that particular  
30 design of special license plate to surrender their plates to the Department and does  
31 not prohibit those holders from renewing those plates.

32 **Sec. 8.** NRS 482.36705 is hereby amended to read as follows:

33 482.36705 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:

34 (a) If a new special license plate is authorized by an act of the Legislature after  
35 January 1, 2003, other than a special license plate that is authorized pursuant to  
36 NRS 482.379375, the Legislature will direct that the license plate not be designed,  
37 prepared or issued by the Department unless the Department receives at least 1,000  
38 applications for the issuance of that plate within 2 years after the effective date of  
39 the act of the Legislature that authorized the plate.

40 (b) In addition to the requirements set forth in paragraph (a), if a new special  
41 license plate is authorized by an act of the Legislature after July 1, 2005, the  
42 Legislature will direct that the license plate not be issued by the Department unless  
43 its issuance complies with subsection 2 of NRS 482.367008.

44 (c) In addition to the requirements set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b), if a new  
45 special license plate is authorized by an act of the Legislature after January 1, 2007,  
46 the Legislature will direct that the license plate not be designed, prepared or issued  
47 by the Department unless the Commission on Special License Plates recommends  
48 to the Department that the Department approve the application for the authorized  
49 plate pursuant to NRS 482.367004.

50 2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply with regard to special license  
51 plates that are issued pursuant to NRS 482.3746, 482.3751, 482.3752, 482.3757,  
52 482.3783, 482.3785, 482.3787 or 482.37901 ~~or~~ **or section 1 of this act.**

**Sec. 9.** NRS 482.3824 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.3824 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.38279, with respect to any special license plate that is issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823, inclusive, *and section 1 of this act* and for which additional fees are imposed for the issuance of the special license plate to generate financial support for a charitable organization:

(a) The Director shall, at the request of the charitable organization that is benefited by the particular special license plate:

(1) Order the design and preparation of souvenir license plates, the design of which must be substantially similar to the particular special license plate; and

(2) Issue such souvenir license plates, for a fee established pursuant to NRS 482.3825, only to the charitable organization that is benefited by the particular special license plate. The charitable organization may resell such souvenir license plates at a price determined by the charitable organization.

(b) The Department may, except as otherwise provided in this paragraph and after the particular special license plate is approved for issuance, issue the special license plate for a trailer, motorcycle or other type of vehicle that is not a passenger car or light commercial vehicle, excluding vehicles required to be registered with the Department pursuant to NRS 706.801 to 706.861, inclusive, full trailers or semitrailers registered pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 482.483 and mopeds registered pursuant to NRS 482.2155, upon application by a person who is entitled to license plates pursuant to NRS 482.265 or 482.272 and who otherwise complies with the requirements for registration and licensing pursuant to this chapter or chapter 486 of NRS. The Department may not issue a special license plate for such other types of vehicles if the Department determines that the design or manufacture of the plate for those other types of vehicles would not be feasible. In addition, if the Department incurs additional costs to manufacture a special license plate for such other types of vehicles, including, without limitation, costs associated with the purchase, manufacture or modification of dies or other equipment necessary to manufacture the special license plate for such other types of vehicles, those additional costs must be paid from private sources without any expense to the State of Nevada.

2. If, as authorized pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1, the Department issues a special license plate for a trailer, motorcycle or other type of vehicle that is not a passenger car or light commercial vehicle, the Department shall charge and collect for the issuance and renewal of such a plate the same fees that the Department would charge and collect if the other type of vehicle was a passenger car or light commercial vehicle. As used in this subsection, "fees" does not include any applicable registration or license fees or governmental services taxes.

3. As used in this section:

(a) "Additional fees" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 482.38273.

(b) "Charitable organization" means a particular cause, charity or other entity that receives money from the imposition of additional fees in connection with the issuance of a special license plate pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to 482.3823, inclusive *and section 1 of this act*. The term includes the successor, if any, of a charitable organization.

482.38276 "Special license plate" means:

1. A license plate that the Department has designed and prepared pursuant to NRS 482.367002 in accordance with the system of application and petition described in that section;

8 482.399 1. Upon the transfer of the ownership of or interest in any vehicle  
9 by any holder of a valid registration, or upon destruction of the vehicle, the

11 2. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.2155 and subsection 3 of NRS  
12 482.483, the holder of the original registration may transfer the registration to  
13 another vehicle to be registered by the holder and use the same regular license plate  
14 or plates or special license plate or plates issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667 to  
15 482.3823, inclusive, *and section 1 of this act* or 482.384, on the vehicle from  
16 which the registration is being transferred, if the license plate or plates are

30 vehicle of which the person is the registered owner. If any person transfers  
31 ownership or interest in two or more vehicles, the Department or the registered

45 5. If the amount owed on the registration fee or governmental services tax on

appropriate plate or plates must be issued by the Department. The Department shall not reissue the surrendered plate or plates until the next succeeding licensing period.

7. If application for transfer of registration is not made within 60 days after the destruction or transfer of ownership of or interest in any vehicle, the license plate or plates must be surrendered to the Department on or before the 60th day for cancellation of the registration.

8. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of NRS 371.040, NRS 482.2155, subsections 7 and 8 of NRS 482.260 and subsection 3 of NRS 482.483, if a person cancels his or her registration and surrenders to the Department the license plates for a vehicle, the Department shall:

(a) In accordance with the provisions of subsection 9, issue to the person a refund of the portion of the registration fee and governmental services tax paid on the vehicle attributable to the remainder of the current calendar year or registration period on a pro rata basis; or

(b) If the person does not qualify for a refund in accordance with the provisions of subsection 9, issue to the person a credit in the amount of the portion of the registration fee and governmental services tax paid on the vehicle attributable to the remainder of the current calendar year or registration period on a pro rata basis. Such a credit may be applied by the person to the registration of any other vehicle owned by the person. Any unused portion of the credit expires on the date the registration of the vehicle from which the person obtained a refund was due to expire.

9. The Department shall issue a refund pursuant to subsection 8 only if the request for a refund is made at the time the registration is cancelled and the license plates are surrendered, the person requesting the refund is a resident of Nevada, the amount eligible for refund exceeds \$100, and evidence satisfactory to the Department is submitted that reasonably proves the existence of extenuating circumstances. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "extenuating circumstances" means circumstances wherein:

(a) The person has recently relinquished his or her driver's license and has sold or otherwise disposed of his or her vehicle.

(b) The vehicle has been determined to be inoperable and the person does not transfer the registration to a different vehicle.

(c) The owner of the vehicle is seriously ill or has died and the guardians or survivors have sold or otherwise disposed of the vehicle.

(d) Any other event occurs which the Department, by regulation, has defined to constitute an "extenuating circumstance" for the purposes of this subsection.

**Sec. 12.** NRS 482.500 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.500 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 or 3 or specifically provided by statute, whenever upon application any duplicate or substitute certificate of registration, indicator, decal or number plate is issued, the following fees must be paid:

For a certificate of registration .....	\$5.00
For every substitute number plate or set of plates .....	5.00
For every duplicate number plate or set of plates.....	10.00
For every decal displaying a county name .....	.50
For every other indicator, decal, license plate sticker or tab .....	5.00

2. The following fees must be paid for any replacement number plate or set of plates issued for the following special license plates:

(a) For any special plate issued pursuant to NRS 482.3667, 482.367002, 482.3672, 482.3675, 482.370 to 482.3755, inclusive, *and section 1 of this act*, 482.376 or 482.379 to 482.3818, inclusive, a fee of \$10.

(b) For any special plate issued pursuant to NRS 482.368, 482.3765, 482.377 or 482.378, a fee of \$5.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of NRS 482.3824, for any souvenir license plate issued pursuant to NRS 482.3825 or sample license plate issued pursuant to NRS 482.2703, a fee equal to that established by the Director for the issuance of those plates.

3. A fee must not be charged for a duplicate or substitute of a decal issued pursuant to NRS 482.37635.

4. The fees which are paid for replacement number plates, duplicate number plates and decals displaying county names must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the Motor Vehicle Fund and allocated to the Department to defray the costs of replacing or duplicating the plates and manufacturing the decals.

**Sec. 13.** NRS 223.650 is hereby amended to read as follows:

223.650 1. The Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics created by NRS 223.640 shall:

(a) Develop a strategic plan for the development of educational resources in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics to serve as a foundation for workforce development, college preparedness and economic development in this State;

(b) Develop a plan for identifying and awarding recognition to pupils in this State who demonstrate exemplary achievement in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics;

(c) Develop a plan for identifying and awarding recognition to ~~not more than 15~~ schools in this State that demonstrate exemplary performance in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics;

(d) Conduct a survey of education programs and proposed programs relating to the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in this State and in other states to identify recommendations for the implementation of such programs by public schools and institutions of higher education in this State and report the information gathered by the survey to the State Board of Education and the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada;

(e) Apply for grants on behalf of the State of Nevada relating to the development and expansion of education programs in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics;

(f) Identify a nonprofit corporation to assist in the implementation of the plans developed pursuant to paragraphs (a), (b) and (c);

(g) Prepare a written report which includes, without limitation, recommendations based on the survey conducted pursuant to paragraph (d) and any other recommendations concerning the instruction and curriculum in courses of study in science, technology, engineering and mathematics in public schools in this State and, on or before January 31 of each odd-numbered year, submit a copy of the report to the State Board of Education, the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada, the Governor and the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature;

(h) Conduct surveys for and make recommendations as deemed necessary to the Office of Economic Development and the Governor's Workforce Investment Board; and

(i) Appoint a subcommittee on computer science consisting of at least three members to provide advice and recommendations to:

(1) The State Board of Education, the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools, the boards of trustees of school districts and the governing bodies of charter schools and university schools for profoundly gifted pupils concerning the curriculum and materials for courses in computer science and computer education and technology and professional development for teachers who teach such courses; and

(2) The Commission on Professional Standards in Education concerning the qualifications for licensing teachers and other educational personnel who teach courses in computer science or computer education and technology.

2. Each year the Council:

(a) Shall establish an event in southern Nevada and an event in northern Nevada to recognize pupils in this State who demonstrate exemplary achievement in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics. ~~["The events must be held at an institution of higher education in this State."]~~

(b) Shall establish a statewide event ~~["which must be held in Carson City"]~~ to recognize ~~["not more than 15"]~~ schools in this State that have demonstrated exemplary performance in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics.

(c) May accept any gifts, grants or donations from any source for use in carrying out the provisions of this subsection.

3. The Council or a subcommittee of the Council may seek the input, advice and assistance of persons and organizations that have knowledge, interest or expertise relevant to the duties of the Council.

4. The State Board of Education and the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada shall consider the plans developed by the Advisory Council on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics pursuant to paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of subsection 1 and the written report submitted pursuant to paragraph (g) of subsection 1. The State Board of Education shall adopt such regulations as the State Board deems necessary to carry out the recommendations in the written report.

**Sec. 14.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor for awarding grants to elementary schools in this State to promote equitable access to and increase the quality of programs designed to introduce and teach science, technology, engineering and mathematics the following sums:

For the Fiscal Year 2019-2020..... \$250,000

For the Fiscal Year 2020-2021..... \$250,000

2. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Office of Science, Innovation and Technology in the Office of the Governor to create a grant program for awarding grants in this State through regional advisory boards in each of three regions of this State to fund activities and programs in this State designed to increase awareness of, promote the benefits of and carry out programs that reinforce education in science, technology, engineering and mathematics the following sums:

For the Fiscal Year 2019-2020..... \$300,000

For the Fiscal Year 2020-2021..... \$300,000

3. The sums appropriated in subsections 1 and 2 are available for either fiscal year. Any balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2021, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which the money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 17, 2021, by either entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or

transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 17, 2021.
