AN ACT making an appropriation to the Nevada Commission on Minority Affairs for operating expenses of the Commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** (Deleted by amendment.)

2 **Sec. 2.** (Deleted by amendment.)

3 **Sec. 3.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
4 General Fund to the Nevada Commission on Minority Affairs
5 created by NRS 232.852 for operating expenses of the Commission,
6 including, without limitation, expenses for outreach efforts and
7 travel of the members of the Commission and the Minority Affairs
8 Management Analyst employed pursuant to NRS 232.525, the
9 following sums:

10 For the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 \$15,126

11 For the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 \$9,109

12 2. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for
13 either fiscal year. Any remaining balance of those sums must not be
14 committed for expenditure after June 30, 2021, by the entity to
15 which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from
16 the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner,
17 and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be



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1 spent for any purpose after September 17, 2021, by either the entity
2 to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the
3 money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be
4 reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 17, 2021.

5 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2019.
