<u>Senate Bill 80 (2nd Reprint)</u> was heard in this Committee on June 2, 2019, and was sponsored by the Senate Committee on Education on behalf of the Clark County School District (Exhibit C).

Senate Bill 80 (2nd Reprint) requires the director of the Office for a Safe and Respectful Learning Environment in Nevada's Department of Education to establish the Handle with Care Program and provide training to school officials and other persons who will be involved with the Program. This bill requires law enforcement officers and agencies to notify the Program of certain information about a child who may attend a public school and who has been exposed to a traumatic event. Information about such a child must be forwarded to trained personnel at the school who are to take appropriate actions to reduce the negative impact of the traumatic event on the child.

The bill also changes the name of the Safe-to-Tell Program to the SafeVoice Program, a program that enables any person to anonymously report, in certain circumstances, dangerous, violent, or unlawful activity related to public schools.
