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Chairwoman Cohen:

[Roll was taken.] We are here to take action on <u>Senate Bill 202 (1st Reprint)</u>. Ms. Lyons will read the work session document.

Senate Bill 202 (1st Reprint): Revises provisions relating to children with disabilities. (BDR 34-685)

Marsheilah Lyons, Committee Policy Analyst:

<u>Senate Bill 202 (1st Reprint)</u> requires the board of trustees of each school district and the governing body of each charter school to report to the Department of Education: (1) the number of pupils enrolled in each school in the district or charter school, as applicable, for whom the district has established a plan to facilitate the education of pupils with disabilities; and (2) the disabilities with which those pupils have been diagnosed. The measure also requires the Department to compile a report of that information and post the report on the Internet. In addition, the Department is required to provide information concerning certain services for children with disabilities to the parent or guardian of each pupil with a plan.

Finally, the bill requires the Commission on Autism Spectrum Disorder or its successor organization to: (1) study the processes used to evaluate a child with autism for the purposes of the Autism Treatment Assistance Program, Medicaid and education; and (2) submit to the Legislative Committee on Health Care a report of recommendations for standardizing those processes by not later than September 1, 2020.

No amendments are included for this measure.
