Cindy Jones, Assembly Fiscal Analyst, Fiscal Analysis Division, Legislative Counsel Bureau, presented <u>Assembly Bill 151</u> to the members.

Assembly Bill 151: Provides for the protection of children who are victims of commercial sexual exploitation. (BDR 38-457)

THE MOTION PASSED. (Assemblyman Hambrick was not present for the vote.)

Cindy Jones, Assembly Fiscal Analyst, Fiscal Analysis Division, Legislative Counsel Bureau, presented <u>Assembly Bill 267 (1st Reprint)</u> to the members with a technical amendment.

<u>Assembly Bill 267 (1st Reprint)</u>: Provides compensation to certain persons who were wrongfully convicted. (BDR 3-657)

ASSEMBLYWOMAN MONROE-MORENO SECONDED THE MOTION.

Assemblyman Kramer stated he was not in favor of the bill and believed the compensation should be half cash and half annuity.

THE MOTION PASSED. (Assemblyman Kramer voted no. Assemblyman Hambrick was not present for the vote.)

Cindy Jones, Assembly Fiscal Analyst, Fiscal Analysis Division, Legislative Counsel Bureau, presented <u>Assembly Bill 298 (1st Reprint)</u> to the members.

Assembly Bill 298 (1st Reprint): Requires an agency which provides child welfare services to adopt a plan for the recruitment and retention of foster homes. (BDR 38-1061)

ASSEMBLYWOMAN BENITEZ-THOMPSON MOVED TO DO PASS AS AMENDED <u>ASSEMBLY BILL 298 (1ST REPRINT)</u>.

ASSEMBLYWOMAN MONROE-MORENO SECONDED THE MOTION.

THE MOTION PASSED. (Assemblyman Hambrick was not present for the vote.)

Assemblyman Kramer stated he changed his mind and was in favor of <u>Assembly Bill 267</u> and asked how he could change his vote.

Chair Carlton stated that he could change his vote when the full Assembly voted.

Chair Carlton opened the meeting for public comment. Seeing none, she adjourned the meeting at 12:00 p.m.
