ASSEMBLY BILL 182: Designates neon as the official state element of the State of Nevada. (BDR 19-670)

Assemblywoman Sarah Peters, Assembly District No. 24, did a brief introduction to the bill designating neon as the State element. The Montessori school approached her, the class of fifth and sixth graders, with the idea of making neon the State element. No other state has an official element so this is unique to Nevada.

Will Durham, Teacher, Carson Montessori School, gave a statement, Neon, Nevada State Symbol Proposal (<u>Exhibit C</u>). The presentation was accompanied by pictures of the neon signs around Nevada (<u>Exhibit D</u>).

Tyler Varner, Student, Carson Montessori School, gave a presentation about the importance of a State element (Exhibit E).

Senator Pickard asked why not silver?

Mr. Varner replied silver is a metal and an element. Neon deserves to be a State element.

Chair Ohrenschall stated neon is a noble gas.

Devyn Kellner, Student, Carson Montessori School, gave a presentation about the energy efficiency of neon (<u>Exhibit F</u>).

Sadie Brown, Student, Carson Montessori School, gave a presentation about the Nevada glow (Exhibit G).

Chair Ohrenschall closed the hearing on A.B. 182.

SENATOR GANSERT MOVED TO DO PASS A.B. 182.

SENATOR PICKARD SECONDED THE MOTION.

Senator Cancela stated she has more neon in her district than anyone else in the building because she represents the Las Vegas Strip. She extended a tremendous amount of gratitude to all in the Montessori School who have worked so hard on this bill.

Michael Stewart, Committee Policy Analyst, gave a briefing of the bill and a proposed conceptual amendment in the work session document (<u>Exhibit H</u>). Mr. Stewart explained section 4, relating to the Forum's request for an increase in the number of bill drafts, would maintain the Silver Haired Forum's BDR allocation at one.

SENATOR PICKARD MOVED TO AMEND AND DO PASS AS AMENDED S.B. 24.

SENATOR CANCELA SECONDED THE MOTION.
