I made a note about a possible issue with the expiration date on this bill.

I am looking through the bill to make sure there is not an issue.

PETER LONG (Administrator, Human Resource Management, Department of Administration):

I am unware of any expiration date on S.B. 31.

SENATOR GANSERT:

I am not sure, but it can be fixed later; after reviewing the bill, it looks fine.

Mr. Long:

I do not remember this concern.

CHAIR OHRENSCHALL:

I made a note during the hearing. Kevin Powers, Committee Counsel, clarified a question about the *Nevada Administrative Code* 284.444 for the probationary period on an employee who transfers in the same class and continues with that same probationary period, but the period starts new. Is that your question?

SENATOR GANSERT:

No, but I remember hearing this question, and the answer for the probationary period is reset when the person starts the new position.

SENATOR CANCELA MOVED TO DO PASS S.B. 31.
