Are you doing this amendment by amendment? If sections 2, 6 and 9 are amended, what happens to section 10?

The proposed amendment would retain sections 2, 6 and 9. The amendment changes section 10 to clarify the treatment of employees who are employed by the Gaming Control Board. The proposed amendment is attached to the work session document, Exhibit C.

The amendment is friendly and was approved by the State and AFSCME.

I am struggling with section 2; the idea of paying two people for the same job is frustrating. I understand the logic and intent behind <u>S.B. 51</u>. I will vote yes to pass it out of the Committee. But my vote will change on the Floor.
