## INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Senators Settelmeyer, Pickard, Hammond, Hardy, Hansen, Buck, Goicoechea, Kieckhefer and Seevers Gansert (emergency request of Senate Minority Leader):

Senate Bill No. 419—AN ACT relating to unemployment compensation; requiring the Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation to establish and maintain a computerized system for the processing of claims for benefits; revising provisions relating to certain determinations made by the Administrator concerning eligibility for benefits; creating the Office of the Ombudsman for Unemployment Benefits; requiring all benefits to be paid by check; requiring the Administrator to post certain information on an Internet website; revising the base period for determining entitlement to benefits; revising provisions relating to the electronic provision of certain documents and communications; revising provisions relating to the confidentiality of certain information concerning unemployment compensation; revising provisions relating to the overpayment of benefits; authorizing an extended benefit period to begin before the 14th week following the end of a prior extended benefit period under certain circumstances; removing provisions authorizing the Administrator to suspend, modify, amend or waive certain requirements under certain circumstances; revising procedures and requirements concerning certain appeals; modifying certain requirements concerning benefits paid in calendar year 2020; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Settelmeyer moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

By Senators Cannizzaro, Donate, Lange, Spearman, Brooks, Denis, Dondero Loop, Harris, Ohrenschall, Ratti, Scheible; Assemblymen Benitez-Thompson and Frierson:

Senate Bill No. 420—AN ACT relating to insurance; providing for the establishment of a public health benefit plan; prescribing certain goals and requirements relating to the plan; requiring certain health carriers to participate in a competitive bidding process to administer the plan; requiring certain providers of health care to participate in the plan; exempting rules and policies governing the plan from certain requirements; requiring certain persons to report the abuse and neglect of older persons, vulnerable persons and children; requiring the State Plan for Medicaid to include certain coverage relating to pregnant women; requiring the establishment of a statewide Medicaid managed care program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Cannizzaro moved that Senate Standing Rule No. 40 be suspended and that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.
