## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4—SENATOR OHRENSCHALL

## MARCH 13, 2023

## Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

SUMMARY—Urges the Federal Government to use Yucca Mountain for the development and storage of renewable energy. (BDR R-888)

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging the Federal Government to use Yucca Mountain for the development and storage of renewable energy.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

WHEREAS, In 1987, Congress amended the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982, 42 U.S.C. §§ 10101 et seq., specifying Yucca Mountain, located near Amargosa Valley, as the sole location for the placement of a national repository for spent nuclear fuel and high-level radioactive waste; and

WHEREAS, The State of Nevada has since opposed the placement of a repository for spent nuclear fuel and high-level radioactive waste in the State due to the extremely dangerous nature of such waste, the persistence of that danger for an extended period of time, the potential harm to the environment of the State and serious and unacceptable hazard to the health and welfare of the people of Nevada that is posed by the placement of such a repository in the State; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the United States Government Accountability Office released a report on commercial spent nuclear fuel calling for congressional action to develop a permanent disposal solution; and

WHEREAS, According to the report, Yucca Mountain is not a socially or politically viable option for a repository because Congress stopped funding for the activities for the repository in

2010, and the State of Nevada and several Native American tribes are strongly opposed to the repository; and

WHEREAS, The report explains that Yucca Mountain is no longer a sufficient site because the existing amount of spent nuclear fuel exceeds the capacity of the site; and

WHEREAS, In 2021, the current presidential administration announced its opposition to using Yucca Mountain as a repository and instead plans to send nuclear waste to places where state, local and tribal governments agree to accept nuclear waste; and

WHEREAS, During a visit to Nevada in 2021, Jennifer Granholm, the current Secretary of the United States Department of Energy, said that Yucca Mountain will not be a storage place for nuclear waste; and

WHEREAS, In 2011, the United States Government Accountability Office released a report identifying alternative uses for Yucca Mountain, which included the development of renewable energy; and

WHEREAS, In the report, experts noted that Yucca Mountain could be used to develop geothermal energy, solar energy, wind energy, carbon capture, compressed air storage, hydroelectric energy storage, a renewable energy storage laboratory or a strategic petroleum reserve; and

WHEREAS, The benefits of renewable energy include eliminating greenhouse gas emissions, reducing air pollution, diversifying energy supply to reduce dependence on imported fuels, increasing local economic development and creating jobs in manufacturing and energy in Amargosa Valley and nearby communities; and

WHEREAS, There has been publicly-expressed interest in the development of transmission lines in Amargosa Valley and nearby communities which will support numerous renewable power generation projects in need of energy storage; and

WHEREAS, The current presidential administration has a focus on promoting renewable energy and energy storage and is advancing several projects to develop sources of renewable energy and methods of storing energy across the country; and

WHEREAS, The current presidential administration demonstrated this commitment by working with federal agencies to improve coordination and prioritize review for renewable energy projects; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, JOINTLY, That the members of the 82nd Session of the Nevada Legislature hereby urge the Federal Government to use Yucca Mountain for the development and storage of renewable energy; and be it further





RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States, Vice President of the United States as the presiding officer of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Secretary of Energy and each member of the Nevada Congressional Delegation; and be it further RESOLVED, That this act becomes effective upon passage.
