SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8—COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE OPERATIONS AND ELECTIONS

SUMMARY—Urges Congress to enact legislation requiring Medicare to cover multi-cancer early detection tests. (BDR R-1191)

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging Congress to enact legislation requiring Medicare to cover multi-cancer early detection tests.

WHEREAS, Detecting cancer early, before it spreads throughout the body, saves lives; and

WHEREAS, Diagnosing and treating cancer early often allows for less invasive and less expensive treatments than when cancer is diagnosed and treated later; and

WHEREAS, Beneficiaries of Medicare in Nevada currently have access to screening tests for the early detection of only five different types of cancers; and

WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that 5,850 residents of Nevada will die of cancer in 2023 and that there are no effective screening tests for 6 of the 10 types of cancers that cause the most such deaths; and

WHEREAS, According to the National Cancer Institute, age is the most important risk factor for being diagnosed with cancer, and because Medicare beneficiaries are predominantly older persons, Medicare beneficiaries are at an elevated risk for cancer; and

WHEREAS, Several companies and academic researchers are developing and studying tests that are capable of detecting multiple types of cancer from a single sample of blood, which are known as multi-cancer early detection tests; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Minetta C. Liu et al. coauthored "Sensitive and specific multi-cancer detection and localization using methylation signatures in cell-free DNA" in the June 2020 publication of *Annals of Oncology*, which found that multi-cancer early detection tests are able to detect more than 50 types of cancer; and

WHEREAS, Multi-cancer early detection tests supplement other screening tests and help diagnose types of cancer for which no screening tests are currently recommended; and

WHEREAS, Nevada Senators Catherine Cortez Masto and Jacky Rosen and Representatives Mark Amodei, Steven Horsford and Dina Titus joined a bipartisan group of over 300 cosponsors and 400 stakeholder organizations from across the country in supporting the Medicare Multi-Cancer Early Detection Screening Coverage Act; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, JOINTLY, To urge the bipartisan leadership of the 118th Congress of the United States to enact legislation establishing the Medicare Multi-Cancer Early Detection Screening Coverage Act or similar legislation to establish coverage for multi-cancer early detection tests under Medicare; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the members of the 82nd Session of the Nevada Legislature do hereby urge the 118th Congress of the United States to work in a bipartisan manner to reduce deaths from cancer in Nevada; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and transmit a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States, the Governor of Nevada, the Vice President of the United States as the presiding officer of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and each member of the Nevada Congressional Delegation; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon passage.
