INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

Assembly Bill No. 225—AN ACT relating to governmental administration; authorizing members of the Armed Forces of the United States, a reserve component thereof or the National Guard, and the spouse, domestic partner or minor child thereof, to request that certain personal information be kept in a confidential manner; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Torres moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Assembly Bill No. 226—AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada from assessing tuition charges against students who have successfully completed a high school equivalency assessment selected by the State Board of Education; prohibiting the Board of Regents from denying an exemption from tuition charges to a student solely on the basis of immigration status under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Bilbray-Axelrod moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Education.

Assembly Bill No. 227—AN ACT relating to domestic relations; creating summary procedures for the resolution of certain matters relating to permanent support and maintenance, divorce, annulment and child custody; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 228—AN ACT relating to education; revising requirements relating to social studies courses in high school; requiring the adoption of certain regulations prescribing the requirements to receive a standard high school diploma; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 229—AN ACT relating to sentencing; revising provisions relating to the standards adopted by the State Board of Parole Commissioners governing the granting and revocation of parole; establishing a presumption in favor of granting parole under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to provide a written statement of its reasons for denying parole under certain circumstances; revising provisions relating to technical violations of probation and parole; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
