## INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Senators Seevers Gansert, Goicoechea, Titus, Buck, Hansen, Hammond, Krasner, Stone; and Assemblywoman Hansen:

Senate Bill No. 128—AN ACT relating to controlled substances; establishing the crimes of low-level, mid-level and high-level trafficking in fentanyl and certain related opioids; revising the penalty for possession for the purpose of sale of fentanyl and certain related opioids; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Seevers Gansert moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Senators Krasner, Spearman, Seevers Gansert, Buck, Titus, Scheible; Assemblywomen Bilbray-Axelrod, Thomas and Kasama:

Senate Bill No. 129—AN ACT relating to civil actions; eliminating the statute of limitations for certain civil actions involving sexual assault; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Krasner moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Senators Titus, Buck, Krasner, Hansen and Stone:

Senate Bill No. 130—AN ACT relating to emergency management; authorizing a board of county commissioners to issue certain emergency orders relating to public health that impose requirements and restrictions which are less stringent than those imposed by certain emergency orders or regulations made by the Governor; requiring a state of emergency or declaration of disaster proclaimed by the Governor to terminate after 30 days if the Governor exercises his or her emergency powers in a manner that imposes a requirement on or otherwise restricts the operation of a business in this State, unless the Legislature expressly approves a continuance of the emergency or disaster; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Titus moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Senate Bill No. 131—AN ACT relating to reproductive health care; prohibiting health care licensing boards from disqualifying from licensure or disciplining a person for providing or assisting in the provision of certain reproductive health care services; prohibiting the Governor from surrendering, or issuing an arrest warrant for, a person who is charged in another state with a criminal violation related to certain reproductive health care services; prohibiting state agencies from assisting in certain investigations and proceedings initiated in other states related to certain reproductive health care services; requiring certain health care licensing boards to examine the feasibility of reciprocal licensure for health care providers who provide reproductive health care services in other states; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Senator Cannizzaro moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.
