#### **Chair Cohen:**

[Roll was called. Rules and protocol of the Committee were reviewed.] We have three bills today on our work session. We will begin with <u>Senate Bill 13</u>.

**Senate Bill 13:** Revises provisions governing pest control. (BDR 49-234)

## **Becky Peratt, Committee Policy Analyst:**

<u>Senate Bill 13</u> clarifies that employees of a governmental agency who engage in pest control must obtain a license as an applicator from the State Department of Agriculture [<u>Exhibit C</u>]. The bill also requires that certain records be kept at each place of business at which a person sells or distributes restricted-use pesticides. Finally, <u>S.B. 13</u> updates certain references to existing federal law. There are no amendments to this measure.

ASSEMBLYMAN WATTS SECONDED THE MOTION.

**Senate Bill 113 (1st Reprint):** Revises provisions relating to groundwater management plans. (BDR 48-595)

## **Becky Peratt, Committee Policy Analyst:**

<u>Senate Bill 113 (1st Reprint)</u> revises provisions relating to groundwater management plans [<u>Exhibit D</u>]. Additionally, <u>S.B. 113 (R1)</u> requires the State Engineer to affirm or modify the

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perennial yield of a basin at the same time he or she designates a basin as a critical management area and authorizes the State Engineer to modify the perennial yield based on the best available science. Finally, <u>S.B. 113 (R1)</u> requires the State Engineer to review an approved groundwater management plan that has been in effect for ten consecutive years to determine whether there has been significant progress towards stabilizing the water level of the basin. There are no amendments for this measure.

**Senate Bill 115 (1st Reprint):** Revises provisions relating to the mitigation of certain projects. (BDR 20-679)

#### **Becky Peratt, Committee Policy Analyst:**

<u>Senate Bill 115 (1st Reprint)</u> authorizes a board of county commissioners to: (1) establish, use, and operate an in-lieu fee program for compensatory mitigation in accordance with guidelines set forth in certain federal regulations; and (2) enter into a cooperative agreement with a public agency or nonprofit organization for the operation of the in-lieu fee program [Exhibit E]. There are no amendments for this measure.
