VETOED BILL PROCESS

After a bill passes both houses of the Legislature, it is presented to the Governor for approval. Three options are available to the Governor: (1) sign the bill; (2) veto the bill; or (3) allow the bill to become law without signature. The Governor has five days to sign or veto a bill that is presented more than five days before the end of the legislative session. When the Governor receives a bill five or fewer days before the session ends, the Governor has ten days after the session adjourns *sine die* to take action on the bill. If the Governor fails to sign or veto a bill within the time allowed under the *Nevada Constitution*, the bill becomes law without signature. Sundays and the date of delivery are not counted when calculating the time allotted to the Governor for action.

For a vetoed bill to become law, two-thirds of the members elected to each house must vote to override the Governor's veto. When the Governor vetoes a bill, the bill is returned to the house of origin along with the Governor's veto message or statement. If the house of origin sustains the Governor's veto, the bill dies. However, if the house of origin does not sustain the Governor's veto, or overrides the veto, the bill is then sent to the second house for reconsideration. If the second house sustains the Governor's veto, the bill dies; if it overrides the Governor's veto, the bill becomes law. When a veto is overridden by both houses and the effective date is not specified in the measure, the bill becomes effective on the date the second house votes to override the Governor's veto.

Vetoed Assembly Bills Nos. 74, 160, 172, 201, 218, 224, 242, 243, 246, 258, 281, 305, 319, 322, 334, 340, 371, 383, 437, 439, 498, and 527 of the 2023 Legislature were returned for reconsideration by the 2025 Legislature. The bills were read and, upon motion duly carried by the body, no further consideration was taken on the bills.

Governor Joe Lombardo vetoed Assembly Bills Nos. 82, 83, 98, 140, 144, 155, 201, 205, 223, 237, 244, 245, 278, 280, 342, 445, 480, and 490 on June 2, 2025, before the 2025 Legislative Session adjourned *sine die*, and returned the bills with the Governor's veto messages to the Assembly; no further action was taken on the bills.

JOINT STANDING RULE NO. 14.3 OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

The Joint Standing Rules of the Senate and Assembly (Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 1 [File No. 7, *Statutes of Nevada 2025*]) were adopted by both houses of the Nevada State Legislature on February 3, 2025.

Unless a deadline was waived by the Speaker of the Assembly and the Majority Leader of the Senate (Joint Standing Rule No. 14.5), no further legislative action was allowed on a bill or joint resolution. The histories of Assembly and Senate bills and joint resolutions that did not meet the required deadlines cite the specific portion of Rule No. 14.3 relevant to the measure. Assembly and Senate bills and joint resolutions that were granted waivers contain the history statement “waiver granted” along with the effective date of the waiver.

SCHEDULE FOR ENACTMENT OF BILLS

Rule No. 14.3 Final Dates for Action by Standing Committees and Houses.

Except as otherwise provided in Joint Standing Rules Nos. 14.4, 14.5 and 14.6:

1. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in its House of origin may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 68th calendar day of the legislative session. A bill may be rereferred after that date only to the Senate Committee on Finance or the Assembly Committee on Ways and Means and only if the bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

2. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the House of origin on or before the 79th calendar day of the legislative session.

3. The final standing committee to which a bill or joint resolution is referred in the second House may only take action on the bill or joint resolution on or before the 103rd calendar day of the legislative session. A bill may be rereferred after that date only to the Senate Committee on Finance or the Assembly Committee on Ways and Means and only if the bill is exempt pursuant to subsection 1 of Joint Standing Rule No. 14.6.

4. Final action on a bill or joint resolution may only be taken by the second House on or before the 110th calendar day of the legislative session.

FISCAL NOTES

Each bill contains various pieces of information related to its fiscal effect on state and local governments. While each bill is required to include a statement of fiscal effect, under certain circumstances, bills must also contain specific markings related to unfunded mandates and extraordinary vote requirements. Moreover, fiscal notes will also be prepared under certain circumstances to detail the fiscal cost of the bill on state and local governmental entities.

VOTE REQUIREMENTS

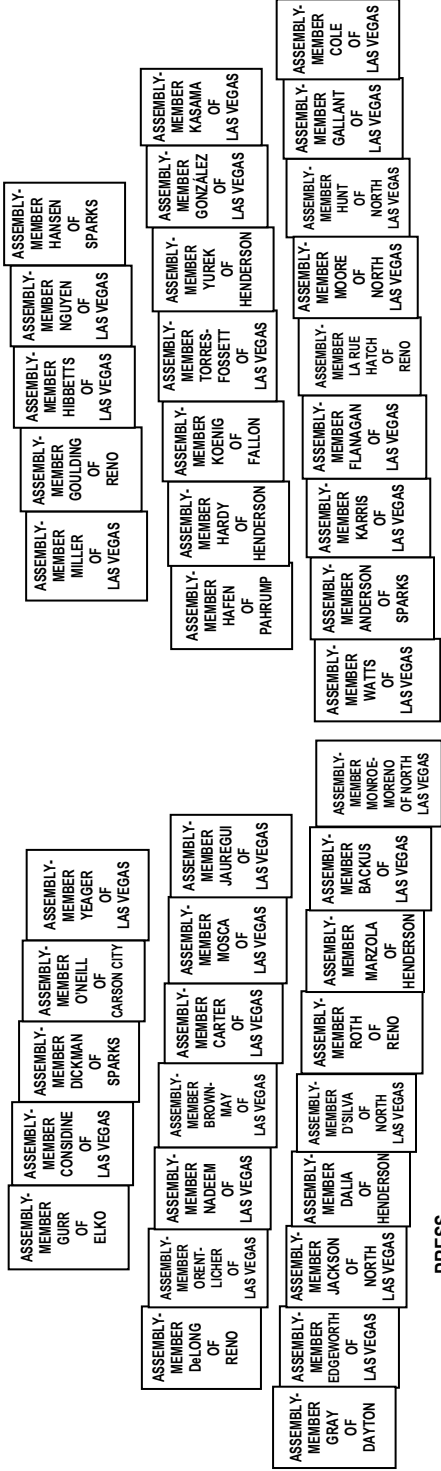
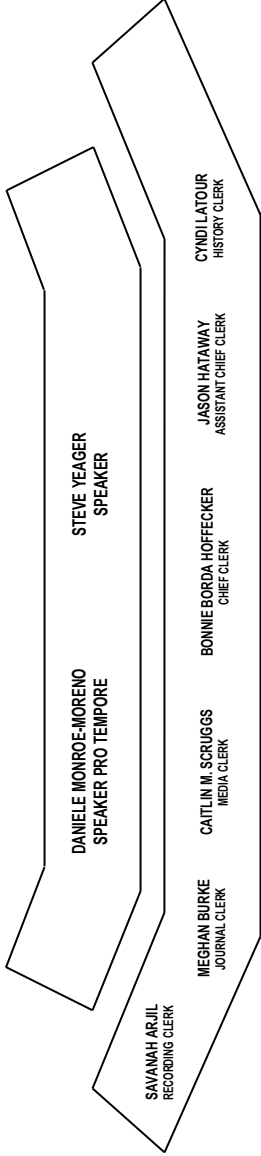
Generally speaking, for a bill to pass, the *Nevada Constitution* requires that a majority of the members elected to each house vote in favor of the bill (*Nevada Constitution*, Article 4, Section 18). However, bills that create, generate, or increase public revenue through taxes, fees, or similar mechanisms require approval by a two-thirds majority of the members elected in each house unless the measure is referred to the voters by a majority vote of the members.
